KARUAH MEALS ON WHEELSA story from the past


Meals on Wheels was started 1989. Loriane Pevitt, Kathy Fletcher and Peggy Griffiths started by travelling to Tea Gardens each week to pick up meals to deliver to the clients in Karuah. Christine Conley volunteered later to help pick up the meals. Peggy Griffiths did the delivering of the meals to our Karuah clients. We then decided to cook our own meals and we did this at home, as it was getting too much to travel to Tea Gardens. When we eventually began cooking at the Uniting Church in their small kitchen, Loriane, Kathy and I made the desserts at home, due to not enough room in the church kitchen. Kathy Fletcher left the Meals on Wheels due to health and also moved from Karuah.

We stayed there until we managed to get the use of Karuah Community Hall kitchen. For us this was wonderful to have a large and wonderful kitchen to prepare and cook the meals in. Hope Simpson then joined the team, and we joined Meals on Wheels and became Incorporated. Hope became the Coordinator and did all the paper work necessary. Hope also did the interviews of the clients to see that they qualified for getting the meals. Our number of clientele varied, sometimes numbers were up and other times they were low, but we were determined to keep it going.

The meals were cooked the same as you would cook at home for your own family, and our clients loved them. They would get 1 hot meal, sweet, juice and fruit. They also would order how many frozen meals they would like to take, so they didn't have to cook themselves. We delivered to Karuah and Swan Bay. (Continued Page 6)

Travelling to Swan Bay in those days was very rough, as it was dirt road and wasn't graded very often. We took turns in doing the deliveries. As time went on we had only one client at Swan Bay and he used to come and pick up his meals.

We had many other volunteers come and help out with the preparing and cooking of the meals and doing the deliveries. In later years we bought hot and cold bags to delivery the meals in, so that the clients had a nice hot lunch and frozen food was kept cold until it was delivered. This ensured that food was up to Health Regulations.

Then came the time that the "powers to be", decided that Meals on Wheels was to be run on strict guidelines. The meals were to be measured out in the containers, so many grams of this and only so much of that. The clients were used to receiving a full container and sometimes they would split it, so they could have two meals instead one. With the new restrictions there was certainly only enough for one meal.

As time went on Karuah Meals on Wheels was told they would no longer be cooking the meals, and the clients would order their meals which would come from Raymond Terrace. I believe that they lost a lot of the clients due to the fact that the meals were terrible. The clients missed the meals that had been lovingly cooked by locals and tasted home made, and not the meals that was cooked in bulk, like hospital food.

I was having trouble with my computer so I called Richard, the young fellow next door whose bedroom looks like Mission Control, and asked him for help.

Richard clicked a couple of buttons and solved the problem. So I asked "what was wrong"?

He replied, "It was an ID ten T error". I said "An ID Ten T error? What's that? In case I need to fix it again."

Richard grinned. "Haven't you ever heard of an ID ten T error before?" "No", I replied. "Write it down", he said, "and I think you'll figure it out".

So I wrote down: I D 1 0 Tl used to like the little #@.

The Worimi are the traditional custodians of Port Stephens. Their connection to the land and waters of Karuah stretches back thousands of years and remains strong today.

The present Karuah Mission was established in 1898, but the first Karuah Mission was established in 1868 at Sawyers Point (where the Karuah RSL Club is today). This was so the people could see their homeland at Soldiers Point.

Karuah Local Aboriginal Land Council (established in 1983) continue to reinforce this connection to land and culture, so that it can be shared with and kept alive by future generations.

This has been planned for some time, originally the beginning of 2024 but now pushed back until 1st Nov 2024. This means that any phone or device using a 2G or 3G sim card will no longer connect to the mobile network, this can include phones / emergency devices / tablets and some cars with sim cards built in.

Because of this, Optus and other couriers have given customers thousands of updated mobiles for free BUT even some 4G/5G mobiles won't be able to make calls after the changeover.

4G or 5G phone refers to the data connection and is not actually used for phone calls in Australia, instead they use a system called VoLTE (Voice over Long-Term Evolution) you may have seen this in the top of your mobile when making a call. A lot of overseas mobiles don't use this system and instead make voice calls using the 3G network even though they are a 4G/5G phone.

For this reason it is important to only purchase mobiles meant for Australia network. This will effect people travelling from overseas to Australia.

There is a further problem, there are some 4G/5G mobiles that can make voice calls using the VoLTE but are unable to make emergency calls to 000. The Government is currently making new legislation to ban these phones from the 4g Network, this will cause a lot of E-Waste as thousands of phones will no longer work.
