Last Day for Lawn Bowls in 2024 is Sunday October 20th. Bookings for Melbourne Cup are being taken now.

PEEPING INTO THE PAST – From the Sydney Morning Herald 22nd August 1938 by Robyn Witt NEW FORESTRY VILLAGE – TIMBER FOR EXPORT. Commission's Project

With the growing demand by New Zealand and overseas markets for iron bark, the Forest Commission has set out to build up on a permanent basis, a new export industry. This activity will be set well on its way when the Minister for Forests, Mr Vincent, next Saturday lays the Foundation Block, in Port Stephens iron bark, of the administrative offices of the Wallaroo Forest Station and Vincent Forest Village at Wallaroo, 28 miles from Newcastle on the main highway.

The new office will be the centre of management of a national forest of 17,928 acres established by the Forestry Commission, and the village will accommodate 40 to 50 youths who in the past have not been able to secure continuous employment, but will now be provided with work by the commission.

The new undertaking follows an extensive reconnaissance by the Forestry Commission of the potential timber lands of the Newcastle region. Freehold lands totalling 3,987 acres have been acquired by the Commission for purchase, and other areas are in course of acquisition to link up previously remnant reservations in a worthwhile national forest

area. The district in the past has been the centre of immense timber activities, but with the alienation and exhaustion of the original timber lands activities diminished almost to vanishing point.

The Wallaroo Forest Station has been planned carefully for the carrying out of the five-fold purpose of national forests – to maintain the timber supply; protect the watersheds; preserve desirable flora and fauna; furnish incidental forest grazing; and provide forest recreation.

The Vincent Village, which will be a notable feature of the layout, will comprise quarters for the youths to be employed. Parking and camping space, with fireplaces and water, have been provided for visitors on grounds which will be known as the Wallaroo National Forest Park.

Groups associated with the establishment of the national forest and village include the Newcastle Young Citizen's Association; the Tree Planting and Preservation League; the Rotary Club; Toc H; Y.M.C.A. and Chamber of Commerce.

Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program

Grant Program for 2024/25

In 2024/25 the Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program will provide grants of up to \$3,000 to sporting and recreational organisations. The Program will fund up to \$500,000 to these clubs across NSW.

In 2024/25 the NSW Government will continue to support organisations which are located, or who have a majority of members in the most disadvantaged areas of NSW. However, we have listened to feedback from the community and recognise that postcode borders do not determine the financial status of a club, so we are providing the opportunity for clubs who might not be eligible based on where they are located, but who are experiencing financial hardship to also apply.
